Felicitation with Saplings

To express gratitude and honor the distinguished guests, the Alumni Cell presented each of them with saplings, symbolizing growth, renewal, and the nurturing of the future. This gesture reflected the university's commitment to sustainability and the environment.

After the felicitation came the official beginning of the session by sharing the thoughts of each dignitary on the dais. First to speak was Dr. Sayantee Roy. She was invited by the moderators to speak on the occasion marking the welcome of Alumni. Dr. Sayantee Roy is the distinguished alumnus of CUJ who is nominated for the Vice President post of Alumni Cell.

Speech by Vice President of Alumni Cell, Dr. Sayantee Roy

Dr. Sayantee Roy, Vice President of the Alumni Cell, commenced the series of inaugural speeches by acknowledging and greeting all the dignitaries present on the dais and in the auditorium. She expressed her heartfelt gratitude to the university for shaping her into the person she is today. Dr. Roy emphasized the responsibility that alumni bear towards their alma mater and expressed her hopes for future alumni meets.

During her address, Dr. Roy proposed the establishment of an endowment fund to provide assistance to the students in need and coming from disadvantaged backgrounds. She encouraged fellow alumni to contribute ideas for strengthening the CUJ alumni community and suggested improvements in promoting alumni meets. She expressed her special appreciation for Dr. Bhaskar Singh and assured that alumni would actively engage in making future alumni events more meaningful and productive.

Address by Secretary of Alumni Cell, Prof. Manoj Kumar

Prof. Manoj Kumar, Secretary of the Alumni Cell from the Department of Life Sciences conveyed his privilege in being a part of this significant event. He extended a warm welcome to all the alumni, recognizing them as the flag bearers of the university. Prof. Kumar commended Dr. Bhaskar Singh and Dr. C. S. Dwivedi for their excellent organization of the event.

He outlined the objectives of the Alumni Association, including connecting past and the present students, fostering collaboration, ensuring the welfare of alumni, creating a network, and effectively utilizing it for collective benefit and welfare.

Address by Registrar CUJ, Shri K.K. Rao

Shri K.K. Rao, the Registrar of CUJ, expressed his gratitude to the numerous alumni who had made efforts to attend the event from various parts of the country. He highlighted the three pillars crucial to a university's development: good faculty members, state-of-the-art infrastructure, and a well-stocked library and laboratory. He commended the Honorable Vice Chancellor, Prof. K. B. Das, for his vision in establishing the permanent campus and urged collective efforts to make CUJ the preferred choice for students pursuing various courses. He particularly emphasized on making engineering courses more attractive and competing with the established

institutions to attract more students. He underscored the efforts of the present Vice Chancellor in the past two years where the development of infrastructure is speeding up.

Presidential Address by Honorable Vice Chancellor, Prof. K. B. Das

The Honorable Vice Chancellor, Prof. K. B. Das, took the stage and congratulated all the attendees on organizing the second alumni meet. He emphasized that students are not just brand ambassadors but also brand equity for the university. Prof. Das encouraged the establishment of strong connections to strengthen the university and foster relationships beyond alumni meets. The Honorable Vice Chancellor expressed profound appreciation for the enthusiastic participation of female students and alumni. He mentioned that while India is having a Women Reservation Bill, it is great to have a woman leading the alumni cell and this event. He emphasized that while the development of infrastructure is crucial, the paramount aspect lies in nurturing relationships and fostering a sense of belongingness among all members of the university community. The Vice Chancellor stressed the significance of networking in life, as it enables the sharing of experiences and knowledge, which in turn, facilitates the integration of positive changes within both the students and the university as a whole. He also added to go beyond nexus to build good network.

He stressed the importance of a sense of belonging within the university and urged alumni to provide feedback for continuous improvement. Prof. Das advocated for better networking and shared an inspiring anecdote about an alumnus who excelled in entrepreneurship through determination. He also mentioned about the alumni's whom he met during a film festival in Ranchi. He asked that Alumni excelling in

film making may also be called for interaction with the students providing them with other options.

Prof. Das emphasized setting clear goals and working tirelessly to achieve them. He called for envisioning where CUJ should stand in the next ten years. He invoked the words of the present Prime Minister of India, "sabka saath, sabka vikas. He added that in this slogan sabka vishwas, sabka prayaas may be added and encouraged every stakeholder to contribute to CUJ's development.

Additionally, he proposed several initiatives, including maintaining thriving connections among alumni, the creation of a CUJ Alumni newsletter, and personal meetings among alumni. He welcomed alumni to visit CUJ when available in Ranchi, expressing the university's eagerness to host them. He appreciated the Endowment Fund proposal put forth by Dr. Sayantee Roy, suggesting it as a valuable addition to the Alumni Association's efforts.

Cultural Performances

After the formal inaugural speeches, the cultural programme began. There altogether four performances which included Odissi, Kathak performances and folk songs. The first performance was an Odissi Dance.

Second Session

The Second session began at around 3.00 pm in the auditorium of Science Building. Dr. Bhaskar Singh requested Deans of different Schools (School of Natural Sciences, School of Natural Resource Management and Humanities) to share their thoughts. This was followed by alumni sharing experiences from their journey in CUJ campus. Among the Deans, first Prof. Arun Kumar Padhy addressed the alumni. He told the alumni that this is your university and your programme, you should feel connected to it and contribute in its development. Prof A. C. Pandey, Dean, School of Natural Resource Management said University is moving ahead nicely. At present we have some strength and shortcomings which needs to be looked upon and work to develop further. Prof. Alok Kumar Gupta also highlighted the importance of alumni meet and shared his experiences among the alumni.

This was followed by the alumni sharing their experiences. Dr Priya Mukherjee is a scientist by profession stressed on gaining substantial practical knowledge rather than bookish knowledge. Mr. Krishna Kumar Rajak talked about time-to-time orientation among the students and the faculty to make them aware about the technology. He added that teaching should be facilitated as per the convenience of the students. Mr. Nishant spoke about the need for interaction with each other to address the issue of knowledge transfer in view of culture preservation. Mr. Rajat Raj, Research Scholar, Department of Mass Communication, CUJ gave his views on the functioning of CUJ Alumni Association for the betterment of association.
