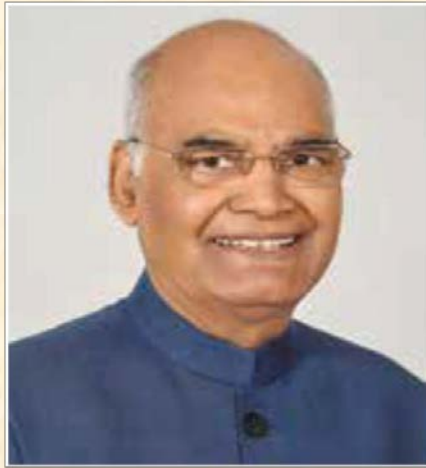

1. BRIEF INTRODUCTION TO CENTRAL UNIVERSITY OF JHARKHAND



The Central University of Jharkhand came into existence on March 01, 2009 under Central Universities Act 2009 with a Vision “to develop enlightened citizenship of a knowledge society for peace and prosperity of individuals, nation and the world, through promotion of innovation, creative endeavours, and scholarly inquiry.” The Central University of Jharkhand is the only central University in the state of Jharkhand.

The University started with four departments in the year 2009 has now 24 departments offering 3 under graduate; 26 Post Graduate; and 22 doctoral programmes in various disciplines such as natural science, engineering & technology, environment, humanities and social science, law, performing arts tribal studies, etc.

Location

The University is presently functioning both from its temporary campus located at Brambe, a 25 KM drive from Ranchi city and its permanent campus being developed at Cheri-Mantu Village of Kanke Block. The School Style Building is housing the departments. The Administrative Building is fully functional with all its offices and sections. The Hostel Buildings are ready and being furnished. The work on Academic Building and Library is going on and shall be completed soon. The infrastructure in the permanent campus is developed in such a fashion that it will provide the students a promising academic environment for their scholarly development.

The city of Ranchi is located at 23.23 N and 85.23 E at a height of 2140 feet above sea level. The city Ranchi is the educational hub of Jharkhand with many prestigious schools, colleges and institution of higher education like Ranchi University, IIM, National Law University, Raksha Shakti University, Birsa Agriculture University, Birla Institute of Technology, National Institute of Foundry Technology, Central Institute of Psychiatry, Lac Research Institute etc. spread in and around the picturesque capital city.

5. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The admission in the various programmes involves two stages viz., 1. submitting application form and taking entrance test wherever applicable; and 2. Counselling and Registration.

1. Application Form and Entrance Test

Central University of Jharkhand (CUJ) offers admission in Undergraduate, Postgraduate and Doctoral (Ph. D.) programs based on the Entrance Test conducted at National Level by the Central University Combined Entrance Test (CUCET) or through the Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering (GATE) score for engineering disciplines or through Common Admission Test (CAT) score for Business Management or as decided by the University.

The CUCET entrance test usually conducted during the month of May-June. Admissions are taken according to merit in the Entrance Tests or score obtained in the GATE or CAT wherever applicable, subject to fulfilling of eligibility requirements and reservation. However, candidates qualified in UGC NET.... are exempted from taking the entrance test. **The candidates are strongly advised to read the admission notification and instructions contained therein carefully as notified by the CUCET Authority before applying.**

2. Counselling and Registration

1. All prospective Candidates/Applicants desirous to take admission in the programs /course offered by the Central University of Jharkhand, must participate in online registration and counselling process. Candidate must satisfy the following conditions:
 - a. Must have appeared in the entrance test in the relevant programs/course/subjects, and have score above cut-off (wherever applicable).
 - b. Must meet the eligibility criteria for admission to the concerned programmes/course/subjects. Please note that it is sole responsibility of the candidate to ensure eligibility at the counselling stage. The admission of a candidate shall be cancelled if the eligibility claimed by him/her is found to be incorrect during or after the admission process. **(Please refer the eligibility criteria of the respective programs)**
2. Candidate(s) satisfying the above conditions and desirous to take admission, must participate in online register process at www.cuj.ac.in by paying a non-refundable **fee of ₹ 800.00 (for UR/OBC/EWS candidates), ₹ 400.00 (for SC/ST candidates) and ₹ 200.00 (for DAP (PwD) candidates)**. The Female candidates are exempted from the registration fee. The link for online registration process shall be notified separately.
3. Candidate(s) is/are advised to complete the registration process as per the schedule

as notified on the University website.

4. Candidate(s) who has/have not registered for online counselling will not be considered for subsequent stages of counselling/ admission process.
5. Candidate(s) must ensure that mobile no. and e-mail ID provided by him/her are valid and are active during counselling/admission period. The mobile no. and the e-mail ID must be his/her own or of the immediate family members /Guardians.
6. Candidate(s) is/are also advised to pay the fee from his/her own account or the account of immediate family member/guardians, and it should not be from the account of others or unknown person because the refund of fee will be remitted in the same account, if any, arising out of cancellation or otherwise. It is advised to keep a copy of the fee receipt either in digital or print form for future reference, if required
7. **The process of seat allocation is an automatic process based on data provided and documents submitted during online registration by the candidates, among them who are in merit** in multiple rounds of allocation by following the GOI reservation policy and also subject to the verification **of uploaded relevant self-attested documents such as certificates (qualifying examination), category certificate, GATE/CAT score (as applicable), character certificate, CLC/Migration/SLC (as applicable), self-declaration and other certificates (as applicable), etc by the concerned department of the University. If submitted documents shall be found in order during verification**, the provisional merit shall be published on university website.
8. During the automatic seat allocation process, as and when a candidate secures a seat in merit, the offer of admission will be communicated through registered E-mail. Therefore, the candidates are advised to check their registered E-mail frequently.
9. Once an offer of admission is made, the candidate(s) is/are required to complete the admission process including payment of admission fee within stipulated date(s) for that particular round of counselling/admission. On failure to complete the admission process including the payment of fee by the stipulated date, the offer of admission shall be cancelled and the seat will be automatically allotted to the next candidate in order of merit.
Note: In All the cases, the candidate will not be considered in subsequent round(s) of counselling for admission.
10. Completion of admission process requires the candidate to login to the portal, fill up necessary information, and upload the requisite documents and pay the requisite admission fee as specified by the University for admission to respective programmes/course/subjects.
11. On successful completion of the admission process, the admission shall be purely provisional subject to the original documents verification. The Department-wise original documents verification schedule shall be notified separately to confirm the admission.

12. **Any refund or fee entitled to be refunded shall be remitted after completion of the admission process as per the fee refund rule of the University or UGC, whichever is applicable.**
13. Admission to the hostel is a separate process and the candidate is required to register separately as per the schedule notified on the website.

NOTE: If there will be any change in the admission process/eligibility criteria, etc. of either as a whole or program specific, shall be notified separately. The candidates are advised to visit regularly on the University website for more details and updates.

8. RESERVATION POLICY

1. Reservation Policy for admission in Central University of Jharkhand as per Government of India rules

- (i). Scheduled Castes (SC): 15% of the seats of the program
- (ii). Schedule Tribes (ST): 7.5% of the seats of the program
- (iii). Other Backward Classes (OBC-Non-Creamy Layers): 27% of the seats of the program
- (iv). Economically Weaker Section (EWS): 10% of the seats of the program
- (v). Differently Abled : 5% (Horizontal Reservation)

The seats reserved for the SC/ST shall be filled by the SC/ST candidates only. However, in the case of non-availability of the eligible candidates, the reserved seats may be interchanged between the SC & ST. If still any seat remains unfilled, the same shall be left vacant. The seats reserved for the EWS/OBCs (Non-Creamy Layers) shall be filled with the EWS/OBC (Non-Creamy Layers) candidates only.

2. OBC (Non-Creamy Layer) Applicants

- (i). OBC (Non-Creamy Layer) applicants in order to claim the reservation benefit, are required to produce valid certificate in the GOI format **(Refer Category Certificate and Format)**. The certificate must be issued **after 31st March 2021** by the authorized officials.
- (ii). OBC applicants are also required to sign a declaration about their 'non-creamy layer status in the prescribed format **(Refer Category Certificate and Format)**.

- (iii). BC-I / BC-II / SEBC / Caste-Certificate / Jaati Praman Patra or any other Certificate issued in any other format shall **NOT** be entertained.
- (iv). In case of non-providing of certificate on the day of application, the candidate shall be treated under unreserved category and the next applicant in the merit list, with valid certificate, shall be considered for admission in this category.
- (v). Request for extension of date for providing the OBC certificate shall NOT be entertained under any circumstance.

3. SC/ST Applicants

- (i). SC/ST applicants in order to claim the reservation benefit, should produce valid certificate in the GOI format **(Refer Category Certificate and Format)**. Certificate issued ONLY by authorized officials shall be considered.
- (ii). In case of non-providing of the valid certificate on the day of application, the candidate shall be treated in unreserved category and the next applicant in the merit list, with valid certificate, shall be considered for admission in this category.
- (iii). Request for extension of date for providing the SC/ST certificate **shall NOT be entertained** under any circumstance.

4. Economically Weaker Section (EWS) Applicants

The Govt. of India MHRD OM No. F. No.: 12-4/2019-U1 dated 17th January 2019 and MSJE OM No. 20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17th January 2019 enabling provision of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes (SC), the Scheduled Tribes (ST) and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes (SEBC), it has been decided to provide reservation in admission to educational institutes subject to a maximum of 10% **(TEN percent)** of total seats in each programme. For availing this reservation, such applicants need to produce valid certificate from the authorized officer **(Refer Category Certificate and Format)**.

5. Criteria of Income & Assets

Persons who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs and OBCs and whose family has gross annual income below Rs.8.00 lakh (Rupees eight lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation (**refer the GOI MHRD OM No. F. No.: 12-4/2019-U1 dated 17th January 2019**). Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application. Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:-

- i. 5 acres of agricultural land and above:
- ii. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above,

- iii. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
- iv. Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.
- v. The property held by a “Family” in different locations or different places/ cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.

The term “Family” for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/ her spouse and children below the age of 18 years.

6. Differently Abled (V.I. / O.H. / H.I.) Applicants

- (i). As per Govt. of India norms, 5% (**FIVE percent**) **Horizontal Reservation** is provided to Differently Abled applicants. For availing this reservation, such applicants need to produce medical certificate from the authorized medical officer (**Refer Category Certificate and Format**). Such candidates will get the horizontal entry in the respective category seats, if applicable.
- (i). Special care must be taken that the certificate bears the photograph of the applicant and the disability percentage should **not be less than 40 %**.
- (ii). In case of non-providing of certificate, as per the above mentioned parameters, on the stipulated counselling-cum-admission day, the candidate shall be treated as any other regular applicant and the next applicant in the merit list, with valid certificate, shall be considered for admission in the category.
- (iii). Request for extension of date for providing the PH certificate shall NOT be entertained under any circumstance.

7. Sports Quota Applicants

- (i). **One (01) seat** shall be **horizontally reserved** for Sports Quota applicants. All the sports quota candidates may get additional weightage as 15% for International, 10% for National and 5% for state level games/ sports irrespective of number of participations (Only highest level of games/sports will be considered). Such candidates will get the horizontal entry in the respective category seats, if applicable.

SUPERNUMERARY SEATS

1. Concession for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants and Kashmiri Pandits / Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants) living in Kashmiri valley for admission in Higher Educational Institutions

- (i). As per UGC D.O. no. 1-13/2010(CPP-II) dated 20th March 2018, the following concessions will be extended to the wards of Kashmiri Migrants and :
 - (a). Relaxation in cut off percentage upto 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
 - (b). Increase in intake capacity upto 5% course-wise.

- (c). Reservation of at least one seat in merit quota in technical / professional institutions.
- (d). Waiving of domicile requirements.
- (ii). For availing this benefit, the eligible applicants are required to produce certificate issued by competent authority and produce on the day of application.

2. Seats for Defence Personnel Wards

- (i). **Five percent (5%) of the seats are reserved over and above (supernumerary) the sanctioned seat for Widows/wards of the Defence personnel killed/disabled in action or during peace time with following priority.**
 - 1) Widows/Wards of Defence Personnel /Para-military Personnel killed in action **(Required Certificate: Proof in Original)**
 - 2) Wards of serving Defence Personnel and ex-servicemen/Para-military Personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service **(Required Certificate: Original disability certificate clearly indicating the disability is attributable to Military Services.)**
 - 3) Widows/Wards of Defence Personnel/Para-military Personnel who died in peace time with death attributable to military service **(Required Certificate: Original death certificate clearly indicating the cause of death is attributable to Military Service)**.
 - 4) Wards of Defence Personnel/Para-Military Personnel disabled in peace time with disability attributable to Military Service **(Required Certificate: Original disability certificate clearly indicating the disability is attributable to Military Service)**.
 - 5) Wards of Serving Defence Personnel and Ex-servicemen Para-Military including personnel of police forces who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards: Param Vir Chakra, Ashok Chakra, Maha Vir Chakra, Kirti Chakra, Vir Chakra, Shaurya Chakra, Sena, Nau Sena, Vayu Sena Medal, Mentioned-in-Dispatches **(Required Certificate: Proof of award in Original)**.
 - 6) Wards of Ex-Servicemen **(Required Certificate: Original ex-servicemen Identity Card/discharge book/PPO(Pension Payment Order).)**
 - 7) Wives of: i) Defence personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service. ii) Defence personnel disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service. iii) Ex-servicemen and serving personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards. **(Required Certificate: Proof of award in Original)**.
 - 8) Wards of Serving Defence Personnel **(Required Certificate: Original Service Identity Cards and Dependent Card/Certificate issued by the competent Authority)**.
 - 9) Wives of Defence Serving Personnel **(Required Certificate: Original Service Identity Cards and Dependent Card/Certificate issued by the Competent Authority)**.
- (ii). Applicants need to produce/submit the required valid certificate on the day of application.

3. Reservation for International Candidates

- (i). **15% seats over and above (supernumerary)** the sanctioned seats in each course shall be reserved for international Candidates. The **5% seats (out of 15% seats International Candidates)** shall be reserved for the children of **Indian workers in the Gulf**.

9. FELLOWSHIPS, SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDENTSHIPS

- In order to encourage meritorious and deserving students to pursue courses of studies and research in the University without great financial strain, the University shall strive to provide for adequate number of Scholarships, Fellowships, Studentships and Free-ships for financial help, and also provide for award of Medals and Prizes.
- There shall be instituted Scholarships in every subject to be awarded to the students of the University subject to availability of funds. Rules for award of the same will be laid down in the Regulations.
- There shall be fee concession in the form of half and full Free-ships of tuition fee in each Department as per the Ordinance of the University.
- There shall be Fellowships instituted in the University, subject to availability of funds, for studies or research as approved under the norms of UGC or other funding agencies from time to time.
- There shall be a scheme to award medals/ prizes to the meritorious students of the University for their Best Performance in various University Examinations.
- All types of Scholarships and Freeships shall be administered at the University level by a Committee to be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor.

10. NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY - 2020

The Central University of Jharkhand is in process to implement the NEP-2020 from the academic session 2022.

11. CAMPUS AMENITIES

i. Central Library

The Central Library provides access not only to text and reference books but also to a wide range of information to widen the horizons of the users' knowledge and to support a host of their learning activities.

- Book Volumes – More than 30000 books.
- Journal – 50+ national & international journals/magazines e-Resources & e-Books – 4500+ e-Journals.

ii. Hostels

- The university has spacious and well-furnished separate hostels for boys and girls within the campus. In view of increased intake and paucity of hostel accommodation, the University cannot guarantee hostel accommodation to all the students admitted to various programmes / courses. The hostel will be allotted as per the merit – cum – reservation depending upon intake of students in the departments.
- The hostel accommodation will be provided subject to the availability of seats in the hostels for a maximum period of 02 years in case of PG Programmes, up to 04 years in case of Ph.D programmes. In no case, the accommodation will be extended beyond the stipulated period.
- The students are required to submit ‘proof of nativity’ at the time of hostel admission. They can submit a ‘Native/Residency Certificate’ issued by the Revenue Officer/ Tahsildar or any other relevant certificate issued by competent authority of their respective native as proof of residence.

iii. Computer Centre

The Computer Centre caters to the needs of different academic departments and various sections of the University. Computer Centre with adequate number of desktop systems is available for independent study and learning with support from technical staff.

iv. Banking

The university has dedicated banking facility within the campus provided by Punjab National Bank. The bank has an ATM in the bank. The bank provides some the facilities like savings account, RD account, student loan facility.

v. Health Centre

The University Dispensary, managed by Medical personnel including Female Medical Officer, consultant MO supported by Para-medical staff like one pharmacist, one sister, one dresser. Dispensary offers OPD services along with first aid management from Monday to Friday 9.00am to 5.00pm. It has pharmacy store where medicines are available free of cost. Routine investigation like random and fasting sugar level, Hb, Hb1Ac by rapid kit method. In case of emergency, ambulance service is also provided to transfer patients to RIMS medical college

or Mandar Referral hospital. Expenses related to medical emergencies and hospitalization shall be borne by the parents/guardians of the student concerned.



The University has a Health Centre for health care of all the students, faculty members and non-teaching staff of the University. The Health Centre has a male doctor and a lady doctor with supporting staff of Nurse, Pharmacist and Medical Attendant. The facilities like In-patient ward (02), drip facility, blood test and blood pressure test are available. For emergency services, there is a 24x7 ambulance facility available in the campus.

vi. Transportation

There are at present 08 buses plying on 05 different routes to provide pick and drop facilities to the students from Ranchi to Central University of Jharkhand temporary campus at Brambe, Ranchi.

with the objective to foster national integration amongst the participating cadets.

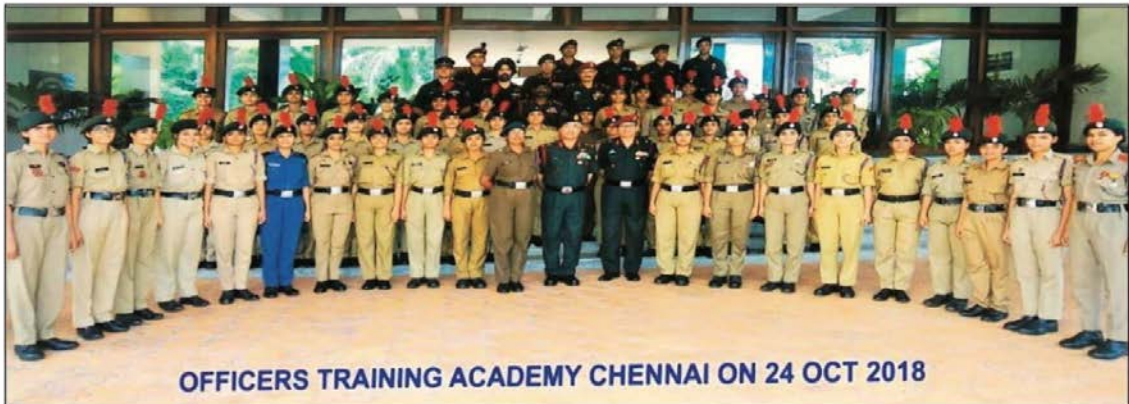
More than 300 cadets and volunteers from Goa and Jharkhand are participated in the camp. Senior Under Officer Dipayan Mahato participated in

13. STUDENTS' WELFARE BODIES

i. Proctorial Board

Discipline plays pivotal role in shaping the character of students. The students are expected to participate in the curricular and extra-curricular activities in a disciplined manner.

However, the cases of indiscipline cannot be ruled out. In order to deal with the matter of indiscipline by the students, a Proctorial Board has been constituted in the University.

ii. ICC Committee

Gender equity, including protection from sexual harassment and right to work with dignity is universally recognized basic human right. The Central University of Jharkhand has constituted a Committee namely Internal Complaint Committee to look into the matter.

iii. Anti-Ragging Committee

The University has endeavoured to be a Ragging-Free Campus. As per the extant instructions of UGC on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, the University has constituted an Anti-Ragging Committee, as well as Anti- Ragging Squad in Central University of Jharkahnd.

iv. Grievance Redressal Committee

A Grievance Redressal Committee has been constituted to redress the grievances of the students.

v. Hostel Committee

Since hostel cleanliness and food are the paramount, the hostel committee will strive hard to supervise the cleanliness and improve the quality and taste of food served in the mess, cafeteria and bakery. Complaints of students related to the mess facilities will be considered and appropriate steps for solving them will be taken. Quality checks in the mess, bakery and cafeteria will be done on regular basis. Infrastructure of Mess, Cafe, utensils, and Water requirements will be taken care of as well.

vi. SC/ST Cell

The SC/ST and PWD Cell was constituted at the University as per UGC guidelines. The Cell specifically focuses on ensuring the welfare of the SC/ST and PWD students and staff. The main aim of the Cell is to monitor the guidelines issued by the MoEd and the University Grants Commission from time to time.

vii. Other Backward Caste Cell

As per the University Grants Commission/ Ministry of Education, Government of India, Other Backward Classes Cell has been established at the Central University of Jharkahnd. The main objective of the Cell is to implement, monitor and evaluate the reservation policy continuously in the University and plan measures for ensuring effective implementation of the policy and programmes of the Government of India, UGC and Government of Karnataka. The University has also appointed Liaison Officers.

iv. Feedback System

The University has put in place a robust feedback system viz., Student Feedback; Faculty Feedback; and Industry Feedback. The students are encouraged to provide the feedback in

teaching-learning of the University. The feedback are taken into consideration in framing syllabus and to improve teaching-learning process as far as practicable.

v. Mentoring Facility

In day-to-day teaching, teacher plays a vital role as mentor and guides the students (mentee) in their academic and related activities to groom them as a good citizen. Students are mentored by faculties in the areas of **Examination; Classroom Learning; Job Placement; Higher Studies & Research; and Personal Counseling.**

vi. Students Counseling, Guiding & Placement Cell

The University has established Students Counseling, Guiding & Placement Cell to counsel students during pre-admission; at the time of admission; before filed work; career counseling. The students are helped in their placement by inviting NGOs, PSUs and Private Corporate houses in the campus and organizing campus interviews

vii. Outreach Activity

The University in fulfilling its educational social responsibility runs remedial coaching classes for NET and GATE. The University has also running “UNNAYAN” programme in which tuition classes are arranged for students of class I to XII of neighbouring villages. The students of the University extending their cooperation as Volunteer Teacher.

viii. Student Induction Program

In order to acquaint the students with the academic and administrative functioning of the University, an Induction Program is organized every year at the beginning of the academic session. The Vice Chancellor and other senior faculty members of the University address the newly admitted students. The students are briefed about program structure, university facilities, policies and procedures regarding examination, attendance, discipline, etc.

ix. Evaluation and Grading process

The University follows continuous evaluation system in which students' performance in the academic activities are assessed through assignments, quiz, minor projects, term paper, book review, etc. in addition to performance in Sessional and Term End Examinations. The grading system is based on the grade points leading to SGPA for semester and CGPA for the Programme.

x. Curriculum Development

The University follows Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). Emphasis is given towards experience based learning through lab based exercises, Tutorials, Field and industrial visits, dissertation & project works, internships etc. Every Department has a Board of Studies which meets in regular interval to assess the course syllabus of the department and give suggestions to bring about changes in the syllabus wherever deems necessary.
