# About the Workshop

The Authors' Workshop on Academic Writing to Develop Textbooks for Higher Education in Bharatiya Languages (Santhali) will take place on 20th to 21st January 2025 at the CUJ. This workshop aligns with the objectives of the National Education Policy (NEP)-2020, which promotes the use of Indian languages, including Santhali, in education. The workshop focuses on creating high quality academic content in Santhali to meet the growing demand for multilingual educational resources. In India's diverse linguistic landscape, it is crucial to remove language barriers, allowing the exchange of ideas and knowledge across various subjects. By developing academic content in Santhali, this workshop will help students access global research, educational advancements, and scientific studies in their own language. The workshop will guide authors in writing textbooks in Santhali, ensuring that millions of UG/PG students can learn in their native language. It will provide training on drafting academic content, creating standard terms in Santhali, using technology and digital tools, and maintaining ethical writing practices. Moreover this initiative will facilitate knowledge sharing across languages, unite people from different regions, and contribute to building a stronger, more inclusive national identity. To create an enabling ecosystem of content creation in Bharatiya languages, the UGC has identified some nodal universities to systematically work on development of textbooks for all disciplines in a concerned local language (one of the Indian languages from 8th schedule). Further, the nodal universities have finalized the name of about 50 books (1" round) and their authors on the basis of the proposal screening through due process. Such identified authors are being coordinated by the Nodal universities to further engage in the book writing process. To support the nodal universities in this significant endeavour, the Bharatiya Bhasha Samiti has conceptualized a unique workshop to comprehensively discuss on all related aspects related to academic writing and to strengthen the nodal university to efficiently execute the process of book writing in local language.

# Objective of the Workshop

The Authors' Workshop on Academic Writing at Central University of Jharkhand (CUJ) aims to help authors write textbooks in Santhali for higher education. The workshop will teach authors how to write in Santhali, create standard terms, and use digital tools. It will make textbooks more available to UG/PG students in Santhali and help its lead the way in creating content in Indian languages. The workshop also wants to make sure more students can access knowledge in their own language and preserve Santhali language and culture in education.

# Key Outcome

The workshop will lead to capacity building of all the identified authors to write books in concerned Indian language. The authors will be capacitated on different knowledge and skills such as steps of drafting chapters, finding and creating standard terminologies, using technology and digital resources, ethical standards etc.
